THE PASTOR'S NOTE ...

"... THE LONG AND SHORT OF IT"

Have you ever given thought to the many paradoxes of the Christian faith? Jesus came to earth fully human (like us) but



fully divine (nothing like us)? God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit have always existed. How does that work? God is everywhere, all powerful and all knowing—difficult if not impossible for us to understand. God is love, but why all the sickness, poverty and violence in the world? (And while sin is the answer, we still don't quite get it!)

As for the "long and short of it", why did it take the Israelites 40 years to reach the Promised Land when scholars suggest that it could have been done in less than two weeks? Or better yet: Why were the Israelites held as slaves in Egypt for 350-400 years? Why was David considered "a man after God's heart", but God wouldn't allow him to build the Temple? (Scripture tells us it was because he was a man of violence and war, but even God destroyed many of the Israelites' enemies?) IT'S SCHOOL KIT – HYGIENE KIT – AND CLEAN-UP BUCKET TIME

<u>AGAIN</u>! Once again the Church of the Brethren is collecting school kits, hygiene kits, and clean-up buckets for those in need and they'll be distributed through Church World Service. The list of supplies needed for each kit follows and should be brought to the Church by August 31. If you want to "pass the bucks", we have a very shrewd shopper in Becky Kwak and she expressed a willingness to do the shopping for those unable or who don't have the time to do so. The estimated cost of the school and hygiene kits are \$15.00 each and the Clean-up buckets come in at around \$75.00. (That should include the desired shipping fees requested. Any excess funds from donors will be put towards an additional kits.

<u>HYGIENE KITS</u>: One gallon Ziploc bag* One hand towel measuring 15" x 28" x 16" x 32" (no fingertip, bath, dish, or micro-fiber towels * One washcloth * One wide-tooth comb removed from the package. (found at discount dealers like **sallybeauty.com**. Must be sturdy with at least 6" of teeth, no pocket combs or picks, rattail and combs without handles are acceptable / One fingernail or toenail clipper (either one is acceptable; remove from packaging); one bath-size bar of soap in the original package / one toothbrush in the original package / 10 standard size bandaids. Search for wide-tooth pastel comb to see an example.) Must be sturdy with at least 6" of teeth. All items must fit inside the Ziploc bag. Remove excess air from bag and seal before boxing. (**DO NOT ADD ANY EXTRA ITEMS OR TOOTHPASTE**)

SCHOOL KITS: One pair blunt scissors (rounded tip only. Remove from packaging) * 3 70-count bound notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no lose-leaf or filler paper) * One 30-centimeter, 12" ruler * One handheld pencil sharpener (remove from packaging) * One large eraser (no pencil cap erasers) * 6 new, unsharpened pencils with erasers (remove from packaging and use a rubber band to hold the pencils together) * Crayons, 24 pack * One 12" x 14" to 14" x 17" finished size cotton or lightweight canvas bag with handles (solid color or kid-friendly fabric. No logos, reusable shopping bags or backpacks. Download sew pattern at **cwskits.org**. All items must be packed inside of the bag. (The **MyShopAngel** website has an affordable CWS Kit bag option for bulk purchase. Visit cwskits.org/bag to order.) All items must be packed inside the bag.



CLEAN-UP BUCKET LIST: One 5-gallon bucket with resealable lid (if reused, please scrub clean. Do not use a bucket that has held chemicals of any kind. No screw lid / advertisement on the outside is acceptable. * One 4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener * 5 scouring pads (no stainless steel or pads with soap in them. Remove from packaging.) 7 sponges, including one large * One scrub brush (with or without handle) * 18 reusable, lightweight multipurpose dry cleaning towels (no terry cloth, microfiber or paper towels. Remove from

packaging) * One 32-64 oz. or two 25 oz. bottle(s) or liquid laundry detergent, one 16-34 oz. bottle of liquid disinfectant dish soap * One12-40 oz bottle of liquid concentrate household cleaner that can be mixed with water (NO spray bottles) * One package of 36-50 clothespins * One 50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic line) * 5 dust masks (N95 particulate respirator dust masks preferred; no surgical masks.) * 2 pair of heavy-duty, waterproof dishwashing gloves (latex-free, non-surgical, durable for multiple-use. (Remove from packaging) * One pair of work gloves (cotton with leather palm or all leather) * 20-28 heavy duty or contractor-type 30-45 gallon trash bags on a roll (remove from packaging) * One 6-9 oz bottle of non-aerosol insect repellent (Pump spray bottles must have protective covers. Packs of 10-20 insect repellent wipes also acceptable.) <u>ALL CLEANING ITEMS MUST BE NEW</u> and all liquid items must be capped and securely tightened. Place all items into the bucket, making sure they are packed securely to avoid damage during shipment. Snap the lid on tight and seal with packing tape. Please DO NOT include cash or checks inside of the kits or the boxes. Send all monetary donations to: **CWS, PO Box 968, Elkhart, IN 46515** or pay your shipping online at **CWSkits.org/shipping.**






BUT THAT'S ALRIGHT ... WE HAVE STITCHING! On

A journal is kept, or we "try" keep a journey when we give prayer shawls, winter caps, chemo caps to organizations or individuals. We donated to <u>Rita's</u> <u>Closet</u>, a <u>Nursing Home</u> through Darlene, the <u>Infusion Center at Reading Hospital</u>, the <u>Palmer Cancer Center</u>, <u>Stahlstown Helping Hands</u>, <u>Laurel Area Faith In Action</u>, the <u>cancer</u> treatment center in Johnstown, our <u>Church family</u>, and numerous individuals who asked for a shawl or cap to give to a neighbor, friend, or family member. We tried to keep records of what we are making, and where they were going, and we try to be as accurate as possible, but we're sure some were given and not marked down (and that's OK). Our records in our journal indicated donating 100+ prayers shawls, 282+ Chemo Caps, 94, baby blankets, and baby shawls. One of the thank you notes we received was from Ron and Linda:

"Thank you ladies for gifting me with a beautiful prayer shawl. We are especially grateful for Edith's(Hay) prayers over Ron as she stitched each row. Ken has been wrapping himself on chilly days, enjoying the warmth. May God Bless You and keep you in His awesome care. Thank you: Ron and Linda

"Thank you all for the prayer shawl for me (on the loss of her Dad). I was comforted by it. You all do amazing work and everything you make always looks beautiful. Keep on stitching ... You are all bringing so much comfort and joy to others during difficult times."

Our dear Sue Kinsey, before she passed, asked for several prayer shawls. She wanted to give them to the women who came to help her and comfort her as she so bravely battled cancer.

And, when Pastor John and Susan dropped off prayer shawls and chemo caps at Reading Hospital, a gentleman was leaving the Infusion Center, after having his dose of chemo. It was cold outside, and as we were giving the caps to the receptionist at the Infusion Center, she asked him if he would like one of the caps we just brought. He of course said "Yes" and he put it on right away. It made him so happy ... and warm. Another time when we were dropping these items off at the hospital, the guard who was at the doorway asked if we needed help (since we were carrying a large plastic bag filled with caps). We told him we were dropping caps off at the Cancer Center and with a big, friendly smile he welcomed us right away saying, "Boy, are they going to be glad to see you!!"

The work is being put to good use! Thank you dear stitchers!
