School begins at <u>9:30am</u>. --- There are classes for <u>AL</u>L ages




- from pre-school children through adults. --- The new

This study, written by David Radcliff, an Ordained Church of the Brethren Minister, is broken down into chapters, and with each chapter there are daily Scripture Lessons to read as devotions in preparation for the Sunday lesson. This book was written by Paul. It's a short book – only six Chapters – but it's full of wisdom. In the Book of Galatians "Paul proclaims the reality of our liberty in Christ – freedom from the law and the power of sin, and



**freedom to serve our living Lord."** Everyone is welcome to attend – if you haven't attended Bible Study in the past, please join us. We're all students, we have great discussion and we have coffee, tea, and snacks afterward!

"Darkness is crawling, Trying to catch my shadow. Hiding. It's here now. Bye!"


